Prize money in all classes, excluding Horse of the Year Show Qualifying classes, will be awarded as follows:-

- ❖ Up to 5 competitors forward in class – 1st place prize money only
- ❖ 6-9 competitors forward in class – 1st and 2nd place prize money only
- ❖ 10+ competitors forward in class – prize money to 3rd place

All HOYS Qualifying classes will be awarded prize money up to 4th place, regardless of numbers forward.

All sponsored classes will receive prize money up to 3rd place, regardless of numbers forward.

Prize winning competitors will receive a card in the show ring which should then be presented in the show office in order to collect their prize money.

HOYS Rules and Class Information

In the case of all Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers, all data given upon entry of these classes is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

Catplant Group of Companies Ltd. SHOW HUNTER OF THE YEAR

This competition is for hunters, mares or geldings, 4 years old or over, to be ridden. Horses must exceed 158cms. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the British Show Horse Association. Entries in this class may not compete in the Small Show Hunter of the Year, and vice versa.

This class will be divided into three sections as follows:

Section A Lightweight hunter, capable of carrying up to 12 stone 7lbs.

Section B Middleweight hunter, capable of carrying from 12 stone 7lbs to 14 stone.

Section C Heavyweight hunter, capable of carrying more than 14 stone.

Competitors must enter their horses in the appropriate sections, but section A will be judged first, and the judges shall have the power to transfer exhibits to section B or C if they deem it necessary.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 3rd place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

Cuddy WORKING HUNTER OF THE YEAR

This competition is for Working Hunters, any weight, mares, geldings or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old or over, exceeding 148cm, to be ridden. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the British Show Horse Association.

Fences will not exceed 1.14m (3ft 9ins) in height, there should be a minimum of 8 fences and a maximum of 12 fences. The course must contain a combination and should contain a water tray. This class will be judged in two parts. Part One (Jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

PHASE I (60 MARKS)	A: JUMPING POINTS	40 MARKS
	B: STYLE WHILE JUMPING	20 MARKS
PHASE II (40 MARKS)	C: CONFORMATION	20 MARKS
	D: RIDE	20 MARKS

In the event of equality the CONFORMATION MARK from Phase II will take precedence, followed by the RIDE MARK, and then the STYLE MARK.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 3rd place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

ExclOOsive Event Hire SMALL SHOW HUNTER OF THE YEAR

This competition is for Small Hunters, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm and not exceeding 158cm, to be ridden. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the British Show Horse Association. Entries in this Class may not compete in the Show Hunter of the Year, and vice versa.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 3rd place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

Topham Barnes HACK OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings, four years old or over, that must be registered with the British Show Horse Association. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association.

This class is divided into two sections as follows:

Section A Brereton Small Hack. Must exceed 148cm but not exceed 154cm

Section B David Stennett Ltd Large Hack. Must exceed 154cm but not exceed 160cm.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

Topham Barnes RIDING HORSE OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings, four years old or over, that must be registered with the British Show Horse Association. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association.

This class is divided into two sections as follows:

Section A Small Riding Horse. Must exceed 148cm but not exceed 158cm.

Section B Large Riding Horse. Must exceed 158cm.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

The Leeman Family COB OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings, four years old or over, that must be registered with the British Show Horse Association. Horses must exceed 148cm but not exceed 155cm. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association.

This class is divided into two sections as follows:

Section A Lightweight Cob. To be capable of carrying up to 14 stone.

Section B Heavyweight Cob. To be capable of carrying more than 14 stone.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

The Binks Family SHOW HUNTER PONY OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings four years old or over. Ponies must be registered with either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS and a valid JMB number lodged with that society. Riders and Owners must be members of either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS.

This class is divided into four sections as follows:

Section A Ponies not exceeding 122cm. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Section B Ponies exceeding 122cm and not exceeding 133cm. Riders not to have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Section C Ponies exceeding 133cm and not exceeding 143cm. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Section D Ponies exceeding 143cm and not exceeding 153cm. Riders not to have attained their 20th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Manners & Way of Going - 50 Marks Maximum

Conformation, Type & Freedom of Action - 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest Manners & Way of Going mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

INTERMEDIATES

This competition is open to mares or geldings 4 years old and over. Riders not to have attained their 25th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Horses must be registered with either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS and a valid JMB number lodged with that society. Riders and Owners must be members of either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS.

The Rotherwood Stud INTERMEDIATE SHOW HUNTER OF THE YEAR

Animals must exceed 148cm but not exceeding 158cm.

The Baker-Beall Family INTERMEDIATE SHOW RIDING TYPE OF THE YEAR

This class will be divided into two sections as follows:

Section A Mare or gelding exceeding 146cm but not exceeding 153cm.

Section B Mare or gelding exceeding 153cm but not exceeding 158cm.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Manners & Way of Going - 50 Marks Maximum

Conformation, Type & Freedom of Action - 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest Manners & Way of Going mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

The British Show Pony Society CHILDREN'S RIDING PONY OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to ponies, four years old or over, mares and geldings. Ponies must be registered with either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS and a valid JMB number lodged with that society. Riders and Owners must be members of either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS.

This class will be divided into three sections as follows:

Section A Ponies not exceeding 128cm. Riders not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Section B Ponies exceeding 128cm and not exceeding 138cm. Riders not to have attained their 15th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Section C Ponies exceeding 138cm and not exceeding 148cm. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Manners & Way of Going - 50 Marks Maximum

Conformation, Type & Freedom of Action - 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest Manners & Way of Going mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

The Price Family MINI SHOW PONY OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings four years old or over. Ponies must be registered with either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS and a valid JMB number lodged with that society. Riders and Owners must be members of either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS.

This class will be divided into two sections as follows:

- Section A** *First Ridden - Ponies not exceeding 122cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday by the day of the competition and not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year.*
- Section B** *Lead Rein - Ponies not exceeding 122cm. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday by the day of the competition and not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1st January in the current year.*

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Manners & Way of Going - 50 Marks Maximum

Conformation, Type & Freedom of Action - 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest Manners & Way of Going mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

National Pony Society/Snuggly Hoods WORKING HUNTER PONY OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings, four years old or over. Ponies must be registered with either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS and a valid JMB number lodged with that society. Riders and Owners must be members of either NPS, Ponies (UK), TSR, or BSPS.

This class is divided into four sections as follows:

- Section A** *Ponies not exceeding 133cm. Riders not to have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year.*
- Section B** *Ponies exceeding 133cm and not exceeding 143cm. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year.*
- Section C** *Ponies exceeding 143cm and not exceeding 153cm. Riders not to have attained their 20th birthday before 1st January in the current year.*
- Section D** *Intermediates exceeding 148cm and not exceeding 158cm, Riders not to have attained their 25th birthday before 1st January in the current year.*

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

PHASE I (70 MARKS) A: JUMPING POINTS 50 MARKS

B: STYLE WHILE JUMPING 20 MARKS

PHASE II (30 MARKS) C: CONFORMATION, TYPE AND FREEDOM OF ACTION 20 MARKS

D: MANNERS & WAY OF GOING 10 MARKS

In the event of equality the TOTAL MARK from Phase 1 will take precedence, followed by the MANNERS Mark, and then the CONFORMATION, TYPE and FREEDOM OF ACTION MARK.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

National Pony Society/Baileys Horse Feeds MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN PONY OF THE YEAR

Please note: only the Connemara, Dales, Highland, Dartmoor & Exmoor classes are HOYS qualifiers

This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of their respective stud books. Riders and Owners must be members of their respective Breed Society, NPS, Ponies (UK), The Showing Register or BSPS. Ponies must not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. Riders of stallions must have obtained their 12th Birthday (small breeds) or 14th birthday (large breeds) before 1st January in the current year.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Show, freedom of action - 50 maximum

Breed type and conformation - 50 maximum

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest show, freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 3rd Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

The Colne MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND LEAD REIN AND FIRST RIDDEN PONY OF THE YEAR

This competition is open to mares and geldings, four years old and over registered in the main body of their respective Stud Books. Riders and Owners must be members of their respective Breed Society, NPS, Ponies (UK), The Showing Register, or BSPS.

This class is divided into two sections:

- Section A** *Colne Mountain and Moorland Lead Rein. Ponies not to exceed 122cm however ponies must also not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday by the day of the competition, but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.*
- Section B** *Mountain and Moorland First Ridden. Ponies not to exceed 128cm however ponies must also not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. Riders must have attained their 3rd by the day of competition, and not have attained their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.*

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Show, freedom of action - 50 maximum

Breed type and conformation - 50 maximum

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest show, freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 3rd Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

COLOURED HORSE & PONY OF THE YEAR sponsored by CHAPS (UK)

This competition is open to mares, geldings and CHAPS (UK) graded stallions, four years old or over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of the stud books of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA). Stallions are required to wear stallion discs in order to compete. All Riders and owners must be Members of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society, The Showing Register or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association. For height restricted exhibits a valid JMB number must be lodged with the respective society.

This class will be divided into four sections as follows:

Section A Ridden Non-Native Ponies up to and including 153cm.

Section B Ridden Non-Native Horses exceeding 153cm.

Section C Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Ponies up to and including 148cm.

Section D Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Horses exceeding 148cm.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Ride/Performance - 50 Marks Maximum

Conformation, Movement & Quality - 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest Ride/Performance mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Producers, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the Registration Numbers.

HUNTERS

Classes 1-5 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show 2019. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward. No horse lower than third will qualify.

HACKS, COBS (lwt & hw), RIDING HORSES

Classes 16-19 and 21-22 are qualifiers for Horse of the Year Show 2019. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward and so forth to fifth place. In accordance with BSHA Rules the annual BSHA HOYS fee of £15 must have been paid to BSHA before the entry is made if the Exhibitor wishes to qualify. The BSHA HOYS fee cannot be paid in retrospect. This fee is not the HOYS levy, which goes to Grandstand Media Ltd.

All horses entered in the Hunter In Hand classes must be entered in the SHB(GB) Basic Identity Record or Stud Book. Owners and handlers do not need to be members to enter or compete.

The Society offers Brood Mare Premiums at selected affiliated shows, but premiums will only be awarded if there are a minimum of three mares forward per class. PERFORMANCE HORSES and PONIES – (Classes 9 to 15).

The classes will be judged on the continental system. The animals will enter the ring individually and will be judged on the triangle.

Method of judging:

GENERAL INFORMATION, CONDITIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS AND HEALTH AND SAFETY

It is important to read the undernoted:

1. Exhibitors/Competitors must make themselves conversant with the General Rules and Regulations printed in the Schedule and Exhibitors/Competitors will be assumed to be fully aware of the contents thereof.
2. Any questions arising out of the Show shall be referred to the Conditions for settlement. Anything NOT covered in the conditions shall be decided by the Organisers in consultation with the Objection Committee and Secretary of any Breed Society or Show Society concerned, or with the Show Veterinary Surgeon, in cases calling for their opinion.
3. Committee's Rights: The Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason.
4. Entries and the right to refuse or cancel entry:
 - a) No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee.
 - b) It is the exhibitor's responsibility to familiarise themselves with the various Society/Association Rules in operation and entry is only accepted under this condition.
 - c) The Scottish Horse Show may refuse any entry, or cancel any entry already accepted, without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to refuse entries from any person who is under exclusion or suspension by any Breed, Livestock or Show organisation.
 - d) Whenever, under this Regulation, an entry is refused or cancelled, or an exhibit is refused admission or removed, the fees paid for any such exhibit may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be refunded and, if refunded, shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Show.
5. COMPETITORS CHEQUES NOT HONOURED BY THE BANK will incur bank charges plus 10% of cheque value in administration charges. The Show reserves the right to refuse the entries of any person who has issued dishonoured cheques in this or previous years.
6. CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED for payment of entries on the day. Only cash payments will be accepted.
7. Cancellation of Classes: The Committee reserves the right to divide or cancel, or to amalgamate classes where necessary. Any class receiving five entries or less may be cancelled or prize monies altered at the Committee's discretion.
8. Substitution: No nomination entries accepted and no substitution of animals allowed.
9. Forfeiture of Entry fees and charges: Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and all other charges. Should any class/competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, 50% entry fees minus any Horse of the Year Show Contribution will be returned where a claim is made within four weeks after the show. No other charges can be refunded.
10. In the interests of Welfare, no horses or ponies to be kept in lorries overnight on the showground and no pens/corrals allowed.
11. Objections: Objections or protests should be made in writing with the Objector's full name and address within 30 minutes of the event concerned and lodged at the Secretary's Office together with the sum of £100. This sum shall be returned if the objection is sustained, or forfeited if the objection is found to be frivolous or incorrect in any detail.
12. Judges: The decisions of all Judges are final. The committee reserve the right to change judges from one event to another or to substitute judges without warning.
13. Age: Brood mares must be 4 years old or over. Foals to be at least 3 weeks old on day of Show. In all M&M, In Hand Riding Ponies & In Hand Hunter Pony classes, all stallions and colts, 2 years old or over must have an NPS or Breed Society Stallion Licence. For Shetland, Exmoor, Highland, Dales, Welsh and Dartmoor, this Rule is extended to 3 years old or over.
14. Disease: Should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, it shall be removed from the Showground and stables immediately at the request of the Veterinary Surgeon.
15. Equine Influenza vaccinations are mandatory for all animals entering the Scottish Horse Show and they must be in possession of a valid passport and vaccination certificate.
The animal must have received two injections for primary vaccination against Equine Influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. Only these two injections need to have been given before an animal can enter the Scottish Horse Show.
In addition, a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination before an animal can enter the Scottish Horse Show.

Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than one year apart.

Random spot checks will be implemented.

16. Veterinary Surgeons will provide on call cover, but exhibitors are responsible for the payment of the fee charged and this must be paid at the time of treatment.
17. Control: Any animal not sufficiently under control shall be removed from the Showground immediately at the request of a Judge, Steward, Veterinary Surgeon or anyone else in authority. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
18. Misconduct: Anyone reported to be conducting themselves in a disorderly manner will be asked to leave the Showground.
19. Cups and Trophies: Exhibitors successful in winning a cup or trophy will be required to sign for it before removal, and to guarantee its return to the Secretary one month prior to the next Annual Show or by arrangement with the Secretary. A deposit of £25 cash per trophy has been introduced due to the failure of competitors to return trophies.
20. Disclaimer of Liability for loss or damage: The Committee and all Show Officials disclaim liability in the following terms:

“In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused to any Exhibitor or to his/her servant or Agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to the Showground by the said Exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises. (Save for the aforesaid), the Exhibitor shall indemnify the Committee against all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the Exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility thereof.”

Acceptance of the foregoing conditions shall be a condition of entry.
21. Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire and other appropriate risks not only as regards their own property but also against any third party claims.
22. Car/Horse Box Parking Conditions: Persons are admitted entry to the show car parks at their own risk and vehicles and their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the car parks at the owner's risk and while every endeavour is taken to ensure the safety thereof, the Committee will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents), be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise), loss or damage to property and any other loss, damage, costs and expenses however caused. Drivers of all vehicles MUST comply with the directions of the Committee, its servants, agents and Parking Attendants.
23. The committee reserve the right to reallocate rings as necessary.
24. The Directors of the Scottish Horse Show Ltd accept no responsibility whatever for loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property on the Showground or the approaches thereto.

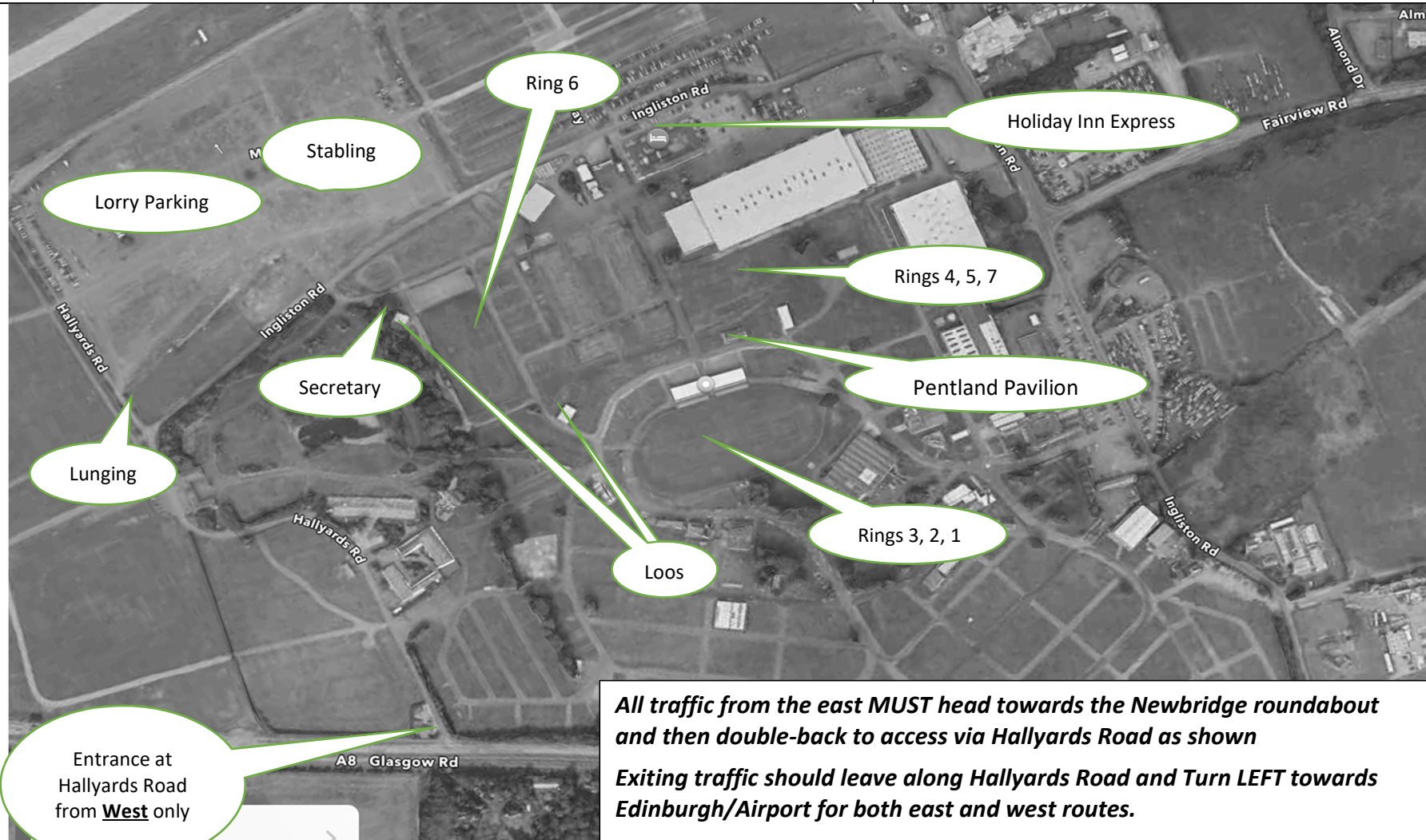
Health and Safety
